CODE OF ETHICS TO CHECK MALPRACTICES AND PLAGIARISM TO PROMOTE THE RESEARCH

Objective: The main objective of this stratagem which is undertaken to promote the research and research publications and prevention of misconduct including plagiarism in R&D.

Background: Research, education and extension are integral parts of any educational system. The reputation of any College depends on quality of research and education. Various assessment, accreditation and ranking agencies worldwide give substantial weightage to quality and quantity of research undertaken by faculty and students of the Institute. Research quality, quantity and impact can be measured by various ways. The number of quality publications in peer reviewed reputed journals; their citations and utility of patents are commonly used for such metrics. Higher the number of quality research publications, citations and patents, higher is the academic reputation of the Institute.

Plagiarism:

Plagiarism constitutes unethical scientific behavior and is never acceptable. Proper acknowledgement of the work of others used in a research work must always be given. Further, it is the obligation of each author to provide prompt retractions or corrections of errors in published works.

There are varying degrees of plagiarism warranting different consequences and corrective action, listed below from most to least serious:

1. Verbatim or nearly verbatim copying or translation of a full paper(s), or the verbatim or nearly verbatim copying or translation of a significant portion(s) of another paper(s).
2. Disclosing unpublished data or findings without permission, even if attributed.
3. Unaccredited verbatim or nearly verbatim copying or translation of individual elements of another paper(s).
4. Unaccredited paraphrasing of pages or paragraphs from another paper(s).
5. Credited verbatim copying or translation of a major portion of a paper without clear delineation (e.g., quotes or indents)

Code of Ethics: Plagiarism

- The core work carried out by the student, faculty, staff and researcher shall be based on original ideas and shall be covered by Zero Tolerance Policy on Plagiarism.
- The core work shall include abstract, summary, hypothesis, observations, results, conclusions and recommendations.
- Every submission related with research will be accompanied by an undertaking by the researcher indicating that the document is his/ her original work and free of any plagiarism and contain a bibliographic reference of the copied part.
- Examples of plagiarism include:
 - (a) Reproducing, in whole or part, text/sentences from a report, book, thesis, publication or the internet.
 - (b) Reproducing one's own previously published data, illustrations, figures, images, or someone else's data, etc.
 - (c) Taking material from class-notes or downloading material from internet sites, and incorporating it in one's class reports, presentations, manuscripts or thesis without citing the original source.
 - (d) Self plagiarism which constitutes copying verbatim from one's own earlier published work in a journal or conference proceedings without appropriate citations.
